Community Updates

You may or may not have noticed that access to some of our common areas has been restricted. Due to State mandates, the Town of Sykesville closed these areas to adhere to these directives. We understand how upsetting this can be to see these signs in the neighborhood. As soon as the Town (and State) lifts the restrictions, we will work with them to have the signs removed.

With some of the common area usage being restricted, it may seem as though community members are not getting as much as for their HOA dues as they were previously, and therefore, paying dues may not be a priority. That is understandable. Please let us assure you, that your HOA dues are continuing to go towards community improvements. Our landscaping company has continued to work hard, and we have several ongoing projects to enhance the community. Neighborhood Appearance

Generally, this time of year, we will see things like downspout blockage, eaves needing attaching, and mold on decks and siding needing power washing.
